We were able to experience many things in the first 2 quarters of school. Along with strengthening our reading, writing, and math skills with our teachers, in August, we participated in Career Day. We got to learn from and interact with community members, such as firefighters, police, the Hawaiian Humane Society, truck drivers, artist Luke Dekneef, and newscaster Stephanie Lum. It was a great connection with our neighbors. We also participate in guidance classes with Ms. Lee, our Computer classes with Mr. Lau, we got to select an activity to participate in 2 "Explorations."

The Hawaiian Humane Society's Youth Program Coordinator, Anne Mukai came again, in September, for a presentation for just us 2nd graders. She shared a story about how to recognize bullying and kind behaviors toward animals, how to help and treat pet and other animals, and to carrying on kind behaviors with each other. A volunteer, Karen brought her dog, Kiko. We learned how to ask the owner's permission and how to appropriately pet a dog. Kiko was so calm and friendly. You could tell she was a pro with children.

We took a walking field trip to the Mo'ili'ili Fire Station #29. The firefighters explained about fire safety and the importance of fire alarms and family planned escape routes. We got to see the equipment and tools they use to fight fires. We sat in their fire trucks. But the best part was handling the water hose to shoot down an orange cone with the jet stream of water! Some of us want to be firefighters when we grow up!

In November, we went to see a play at Kaimuki High School, Aesop's Fables. We made connections in class about fables and lessons to learn.

Later in December, we practiced our musical side for the United States Coast Guard Christmas Assembly, to show our appreciation and gratitude for their yearly gifts of kindness and generosity. Our school is so fortunate to have such guardian angels who give so freely every year! We sang and danced our heart out!
